



Course Content

Cambridge IGCSE English as a Second Language offers learners the opportunity to develop practical communication skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

Learners will be presented with a variety of stimuli that will build up their skills in reading and writing. They will learn to select relevant details, understand the difference between what is directly stated and implied, and practice writing for different purposes and audiences. This will include writing a report on a local charity and visiting them to volunteer. Learners will listen to a range of spoken material, including talks and conversations, in order to develop listening skills. They will listen to conversations regarding fitness and the environment. Learners will engage in conversations on a variety of topics, and develop their skills in responding to different situations and audiences with a degree of accuracy and clarity. This includes a debate on protecting the environment.
