



## Course Content

Cambridge IGCSE Global Perspectives is a groundbreaking and stimulating course that stretches across traditional subject boundaries and develops transferable skills. It is both cross-curricular and skills-based and taps into the way learners of today enjoy learning, including teamwork, presentations, projects, and working with other learners around the world. The emphasis is on developing the ability to think critically about a range of global issues where there is always more than one point of view.

In Term 3, students will finalise their first piece of IGCSE coursework. Their first piece of coursework is worth 30% of their final IGCSE grade and it consists of a 1500-2000 word research report. When students have completed their coursework they will begin studying the topics for their group projects which will start in Year 11. These topics are, conflict and peace, disease and health, human rights, language and communication, poverty and inequality, sport and recreation, tradition, culture and identity, water food and agriculture.
