



Course Content

Oxford's "Complete English" is an inquiry-based course designed to develop student's skills and confidence in English. Recognizing the multilingual and multicultural nature of today's world, the approach supports students in becoming life-long learners who are agile, independent, 21st-century thinkers.

Topics and themes covered in the third term for Year 7 include: Pre-20th century poetry, structuring poetry, punctuation study, grammar in prose, poetry analysis, writing a character report, syllables and poetry, alliteration, content review, Conditionals, reported speech, relative clauses, Linking words and sentences. There will be an oral presentation, a listening comprehension test, an essay-style piece of writing, and a reading comprehension quiz throughout this term. The year will also end with a progress check and some reflective periods, where students will uncover their progress and plan how they will be able to improve and move forward next year.
